Schemerl Bridge Lions, Austria by GREG BALAGIAN

Austria's Schemerlbrücke or "Schemerl Bridge," also known as Löwenbrücke or "Lions bridge," was built between 1894 and 1899 in Vienna.

Because of the site's highly visible location as the gate to the city, it was designed to be particularly impressive. A pair of bronze lions stand on two columns. These lions are the work of prominent Austrian Neo-Baroque sculptor Rudolf Weyr (1847-1914) and were later the model for the logo of Gräf & Stift, an Austrian automobile producer.

Austria has issued two stamps depicting these lions. The 2018 stamp (Scott 2721) shows a drawing of the bridge with the two lion columns and a side view. A closeup photograph of a single lion is on the stamp issued on August 2, 2021.
